Among all big cats, the clouded leopard is the smallest, and best adapted for life in the trees



In proportion to their size, clouded leopards have the largest canine teeth of all cats

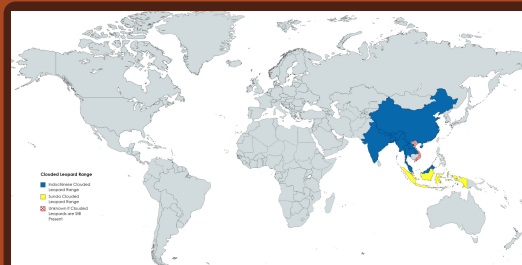

DID YOU KNOW?

Clouded Leopards were once thought to be a single species. In 2006, genetic evidence showed that they are in fact two (2) separate species, the Indochinese and the Sunda Clouded Leopard, the latter of which tends to be a bit darker with smaller, more distinct blotches.
